

## Gold Cross Ambulance Special Event/Dedicated Standby Coverage Options

---

- **Single EMT (First Aid Standby)**
  - One certified EMT with equipment can NOT transport any patient, can start to provide immediate lifesaving/trauma care however will need to rely on the nearest available ambulance to come to scene to transfer/continue care. Can NOT provide pain management, seizure, or advanced life support (cardiac arrest) medications. Can provide simple first aid needs without issue however two-person equipment needs and immediate patient movement may be limited or not accomplishable until additional resources arrive to the event.
  
- **Dual EMT (BLS Ambulance Unit Standby)**
  - Two certified EMTs with equipment who can transport patients and start to provide immediate lifesaving/trauma care however will need to rely on the nearest available paramedic to come to scene or intercept ambulance during transporting to be able to provide to provide pain management, seizure, advanced life support (cardiac arrest) medications, and/or advanced airway management.
  
- **Single Paramedic/RN (ALS Standby/Rapid Response/Adv. First Aid)**
  - One certified paramedic with equipment but can NOT transport any patient, can start to provide immediate lifesaving/trauma care however will need to rely on the nearest available ambulance to come to scene to transfer care. Can provide immediate pain management, seizure, or advanced life support (cardiac arrest) medications. Can provide simple first aid as well as initial life saving measures/advanced pain management without issue, however two-person equipment needs and immediate patient movement may be limited or not accomplishable until additional resources arrive to the event.
  
- **Paramedic/RN and EMT (ALS Ambulance Unit Standby)**
  - One certified EMT and one certified paramedic with equipment who can transport patients and start to provide immediate lifesaving/trauma care and able to provide pain management, seizure, or advanced life support (cardiac arrest) medications/airway management immediately. This level of care matches what an ambulance is able to provide as if calling a 911 crew.
    - This would be recommended to be the safest option for any event where injuries requiring pain management, seizure management, advanced airway management, or response to sudden cardiac arrest may occur to prevent no delay in transport or treatment however we understand this may not always be the most cost effective for groups or extends beyond event needs, so we also offer the above options.
